Unsung Hero Award

Community Service Award

step guide on how to cancel parking at UC, which was widely appreciated by students who had struggled with the process.

UC Nursing Society has attained 56 memberships in just 5 hours at Semester 1 O-Week, reflecting the society's stronger presence and reputation as an essential support network for their students. They hosted information sessions and networking events to prepare students for placements, strengthened their social media presence and communication, and fostered meaningful partnerships that provided exclusive benefits such as discounted scrubs and medical treatment that is not available through UC's Health Hub. Their scrubs donation initiative not only reduced financial barriers for new nursing students but also fostered a sense of community and sustainability within the cohort.
